#### 4. Education and reaching out

Brian Moore was on travel and unable to attend. He briefed NABSLA Boating Safety Workshop on guidelines for including MMSI transfer in boat Bill of Sale by brokers, but agenda is limited. Plan to include outreach to National Boating Safety Advisory Committee 23 April 2024 meeting.

#### 5. MMSI 366073162 from a 406 EPIRB off India

- Legacy MMSIs ending in three zeros – what to do with interleaved numbers.

Discussed MMSIs which may have been derived from previously assigned MMSIs ending in three zeros: 366073000 frequently transferred, now expired, and 367249000 assigned to CGC Alert and 367299110 registered at BOATUS to a 58' trawler. NTIA will be reregistering MMSIs ending in three zeros where change in registration is necessary (eg DOT). Unknown whether registrants of legacy MMSI ending in three zeros are quietly reassigning MMSIs from that block. See AI 58.

#### 6. Freeform identity duplications

- 370xxnnnn AIS SART
- 372xxnnnn DSC/AIS MOB (biggest problem is here)
- 374xxnnnn 406 EPIRB homing beacon

CIRM, responsible for assigning “xx” identities to manufacturers, has run out of numbers and is working with ITU-R WP5B to address the problem. All new manufacturers are currently being assigned “99”. Problem is worse for DSC/AIS man-overboard devices because there are so many of them. Customers of one prominent manufacturer has had to exchange man overboard devices (MOBs) having identical MMSIs. Problem manifests itself especially with AIS, which causes displays to jump locations. ITU-R M.2135 requires all MOBs having AIS to also include DSC for alerting. AIS transmissions and DSC distress alerts from MOBs both use the 372xxyyyy identity.

**7. Any other matters**

Gene Danko (USPS) noted willingness to pursue Seatow’s longstanding request that USPS assume responsibility for Seatow’s registered MMSIs, pending a favorable vote by the Board of Directors. Seatow has 27,600 registered MMSIs, of which 768 are registered using blocks of MMSIs assigned to other registrants. Seatow confirmed one registered duplicate. Seatow suspended new registrations and transmitting updated registrations to the USCG about 2018, but has continued maintaining existing registrations. USPS is reviewing the draft USCG/FCC letter originally prepared in 2020 authorizing the transfer. FCC asked for a copy along with background info (see AI 57).
